



MVM Pandemic Protocol:

1. All staff and students will have their temperature taken before entering the school grounds. General drop-off and pick-up will be the same except only Mr. Andreas will be taking children into the school. Temperatures will be taken and logged on arrival and your child should be masked on arrival.

Staff will self-screen for symptoms and parents must ensure that their child does not come to school ill or with symptoms. Any child showing a fever over 100 will be sent home and required to stay out for a minimum of 48 hrs. Students may return after 48 hours with a doctor's note. **All children must be picked up within 30 minutes of notification of illness.**

2. Masks are required for all staff and students indoors and outside. This policy is not negotiable.

3. Classroom equipment and surfaces will be sanitized by teachers and/or staff after each use.

4. Seating will be spaced for social distancing of three feet.

5. Hand washing and sanitizing will be required at every transition of activity or change of location.

6. Classes will work outdoors as much as possible.



7. Lunches must be in 100% disposable containers. Nothing will be saved or returned home. Personal water bottles are allowed.

8. Students will provide, use, and keep their own school supplies for their personal use.

9. During the pandemic, we ask all MVM families and staff to postpone any activity or travel that could increase risk of exposure to the virus. We ask families to self quarantine if an exposure risk is presumed.

10. In the event of a **Lab-Confirmed Case of Covid-19** at school, all parents will be notified by e-mail and text and the Health Department will be notified. The classroom will be closed until all non-porous surfaces are sanitized. Our school building is cleaned and sanitized daily. The infected individual would be required to stay home for at least 10 days and at least 48 hrs after the last symptom.

Please note that there is a temporary ban of MVM's open door policy. Parents may not enter the building during the pandemic.
